#### 2. Membership and Recruitment.

After a very successful 2023, wherein we added 14 new members. The Milford Fire Department continues to recruit new members regularly and has added two new members this first quarter. This active recruitment allowed staffing to continue to be one of our department's strengths. This brings our total number of active department members to 45, the highest this total has been in many years. The Milford Fire Department continues to recruit at both in person events as well as online through social media outlets.

#### 3. Training

The Milford Fire Department has continued its commitment to training into the first months of 2023. To date, we have conducted 18 department level drills. These have covered topics such as: search and victim rescue, downed firefighter removal, hose line advancement, water supply, forcible entry, cardiopulmonary resuscitation, carbon monoxide response, technical rescue disciplines and many other topics. These drills are task oriented and always directed towards the improvement of the services provide. Additionally, 7 members are currently attending Pike County Firefighting Essentials. Members have also taken multiple county level courses including CO Emergency Response and Thermal Imaging Camera Operations. In total the members of the Milford Fire Department have logged in excess of 500 man hours of training so far in 2023, following up on a very active training year in 2022; where members achieved over 4000 hours of training.

#### Summary

- Members of the Milford Fire Department in 2023 participated in over 500-man hours of training so far.
- 7 Milford Fire Department members are currently enrolled in the entry level fire training program.
- 13 Members Trained in Emergency use of Milford Fire Department's UTV.

### 4. Call Totals.

The Milford Fire Department remained very busy to open the 2023 calendar year with 121 responses of the writing of this report. This follows our busiest year to date in 2022 with 452 responses. Every non-canceled dispatch resulted in an adequate response of apparatus. In many cases the membership was able to staff more units than originally requested.

#### Summary

- 121 total responses for the first quarter of 2023.
- 0 (Zero) failures to crew or scratched responses.

### 5. Response Times and Staffing.

During the first quarter of 2023 The Milford Fire Department has continued to see an improvement in both our response times and staffing totals. We pride ourselves on being the fastest responding fire agency in the county as well as being able to provide an unmatched total of trained responders.

In our first quarter of 2023, the response time of The Milford Fire Department has decreased to an average of just 5 ½ minutes from dispatch. Due to our decreased response times, on multiple occasions the Milford Fire Department has been the first fire unit on scene to an incident multiple agencies away. This level of staffing has also allowed us to respond to multiple incidents in the surrounding area while also being able to staff additional units for any emergencies in Milford. Additionally, not only does the apparatus respond quickly, but on average they are responding fully staffed with an average of 9 emergency responders at any time of day.

### Summary

- The Milford Fire Department averages over 9 members responding per call. (These numbers average lower due to the seating restrictions of apparatus.)
- The Milford Fire Department averages a response time of approx. 5 ½ minutes from time of dispatch.
