ARTICLE I General Regulations

§ 290-1. Definitions and interpretation.

- A. Words and phrases, when used in this chapter, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in the Vehicle Code of Pennsylvania, as now in force, or has hereafter amended, enacted or reenacted, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning.
- B. The term "legal holidays" as used in this chapter shall mean and include: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas, or days celebrated as such.
- C. In this chapter, the singular shall include the plural, the plural shall include the singular and the masculine shall include the feminine and the neuter.
- D. The term "street" shall mean any public street, avenue, road, square, alley, highway, except state highways, or other public place located in the Borough of Milford and established for the use of vehicles.
- D.E. The term "Trailer" shall mean an unpowered vehicle towed by another including but not limited to: travel trailers, camping trailers, boat trailers, utility trailers, storage trailers, commercial trailers or advertising billboard trailers.

§ 290-2. Manner of adopting permanent traffic and parking regulations.

All traffic and parking regulations of a permanent nature shall be enacted as ordinances of parts of ordinances or as amendments to ordinances of the Borough of Milford.

§ 290-3. Temporary and emergency regulations.

- A. The Mayor or, in his absence, the Chief of Police shall have the following powers to regulate traffic and parking temporarily and in time of emergency:
 - (1) In the case of fire, flood, storm or other emergency, to establish temporary traffic and/or parking regulations.
 - (2) In the case of emergency or to facilitate public works, or in the conducting of parades, processions or public events, to restrict or prohibit traffic and/or parking in limited areas for period of not more than 72 hours.
- B. Such temporary and emergency regulations shall be enforced by the Mayor and the Police Department in the same manner as permanent regulations. Any person who shall operate or park a vehicle or tractor in violation of any such regulation, or who shall move, remove, destroy, injure or deface any sign or marking erected, posted or made to give notice of any such regulation, shall, upon conviction thereof, be liable to the penalty set forth in the Vehicle Code or elsewhere in this chapter for a violation of such nature.

§ 290-4. Experimental regulations.

A. The Borough Council may, from time to time, designate places upon and along the 290:3

§ 290-26. Municipal parking zones.

Municipal parking zones are created for the benefit of residents and visitors to Milford Borough, and it shall be unlawful for any person to park any vehicle or tractor or to allow the same to remain parked for longer than 72 hours. In Milford Borough, the lot on Broad Street adjacent to 611 Broad Street is designated as a municipal parking zone.

§ 290-27. Parking of vehicles of certain weights, types and dimensions.

- A. No person shall park or cause to be parked any motor vehicle of a capacity greater than 3/4 ton upon any of the streets or alleys of the Borough for more than 15 minutes.
- B. No person shall park, idle or stand any vehicle which is more than 22 feet long on any of the streets or portions thereof described below:

- C. The provisions of this section shall not apply when such vehicles are actually being loaded or unloaded, nor shall such provisions be construed so as to prohibit the parking of vehicles on private property where otherwise permitted.
- D. For the purpose of Subsection B, the length of a vehicle shall be deemed to mean the full length, including any trailers, trailer beds, camp trailers or other attachments.
- D.E. No unattached trailer shall be parked or stored on a public street or highway. A trailer attached to its towing vehicle shall not be parked on any public street or highway for any period exceeding 24 hours. An exception to these two rules is a trailer being used to service a property with an open building permit.

§ 290-28. Handicapped parking spaces provided.

No person shall park a vehicle at any time upon a designated handicapped parking space of the Borough or upon any streets or parts thereof unless said vehicle displays a handicapped parking tag or license or other designation of authority to park in handicapped spaces issued by the Department of Transportation. The placement of such spaces is described below.
